

### **Adverse Weather**

Bad weather often impacts the ability of a site to participate in a videoconference session. Distance Learning users often live in sites at great distance from one another so they could experience wildly different weather conditions. While it might be bright and sunny where you live, your distance learning partner may be experiencing a blizzard.

With this in mind, one person on the DL team must take responsibility for informing sites if bad weather will interfere with a broadcast. Keep a contact list at home to alert distance learning partners if a session has to be cancelled due to a weather related school closing. Providing timely information to all participants regarding all scheduling changes avoids confusion and delays for the sites that are ready and able to conduct the planned videoconference at the appointed time.
