## LOCAL AIG PLAN REVIEW AND COMMENTS BASED ON JULY 2013 SUBMISSIONS

On behalf of the Department of Public Instruction, we are pleased to provide the following comments based on your Local AIG Plan submitted in July 2013. As mandated by Article 9B (§115C-150.5-.8), LEAs must submit Local Board of Education (LBE) approved AIG plans based on state guidelines to DPI every three years. Local AIG Plans are implemented and developed locally. On behalf of the State Board of Education (SBE), DPI is charged with providing technical assistance to LEAs in the development of their legislatively required plans and feedback on their local board approved plan. Our goal is to provide feedback that supports continuous program improvement and further develops AIG programs to meet the needs of our AIG learners in North Carolina.

This year's submission is part of a six-year effort to "re-vision" local AIG programs based on the NC AIG Program Standards, which were revised and adopted by the SBE in December 2012. The NC AIG Program Standards provide a statewide framework for quality programming while honoring local context and flexibility. Your school district and AIG coordinator have been working to "re-vision" your local AIG program since 2009. We have many well-established programs across the state and are excited to be developing others. We commend your efforts. Below you will find a synthesis of your Local AIG Plan review. This will indicate if your plan submission is complete, complete with modifications needed, or incomplete.
