

NC secondary Career and Technical Education (CTE) empowers students to be successful citizens, workers, and leaders in a global economy. CTE served 896, 176 enrollees in 2007-2008 by preparing them for high-wage, high-skill, and high-demand occupations and further education.

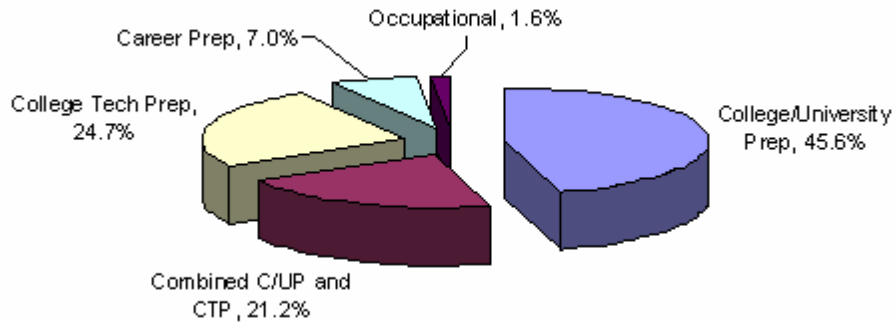

2007-2008 NC Graduates Course of Study



Of North Carolina's 83,294 2008 high school graduates, at least 52.9 percent completed a technical sequence of four CTE courses – 21.2 percent completed the requirements to be both College Tech Prep and College/University Prep, 24.7 percent completed the requirements to be College Tech Prep alone, and 7.0 percent completed Career Prep graduation requirements. This is compared to 45.6 percent of the Class of 2008 that completed the requirements for College/University Prep alone.
