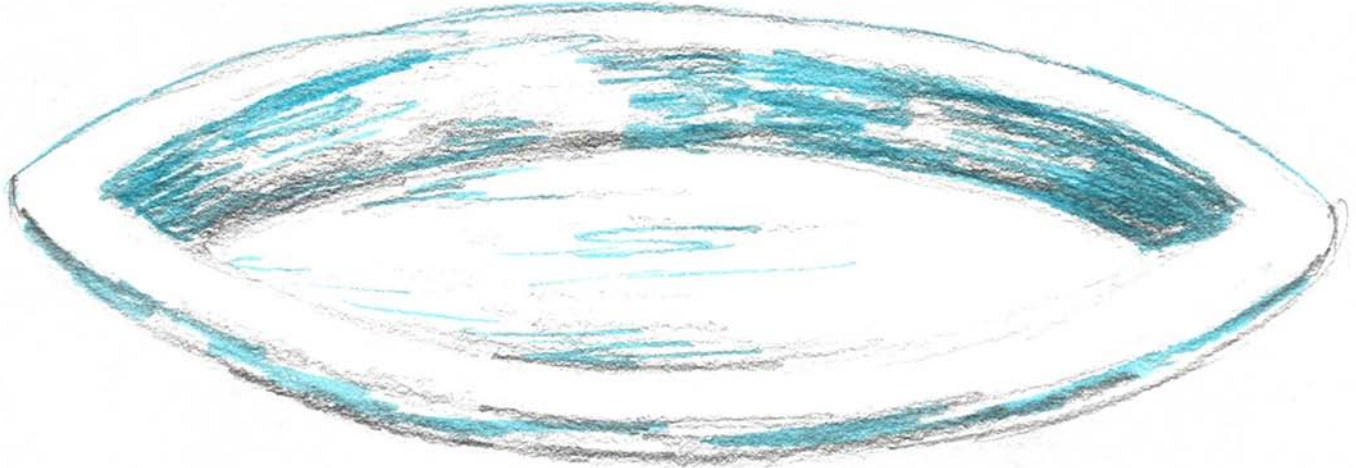

It was hot and I was hungry.



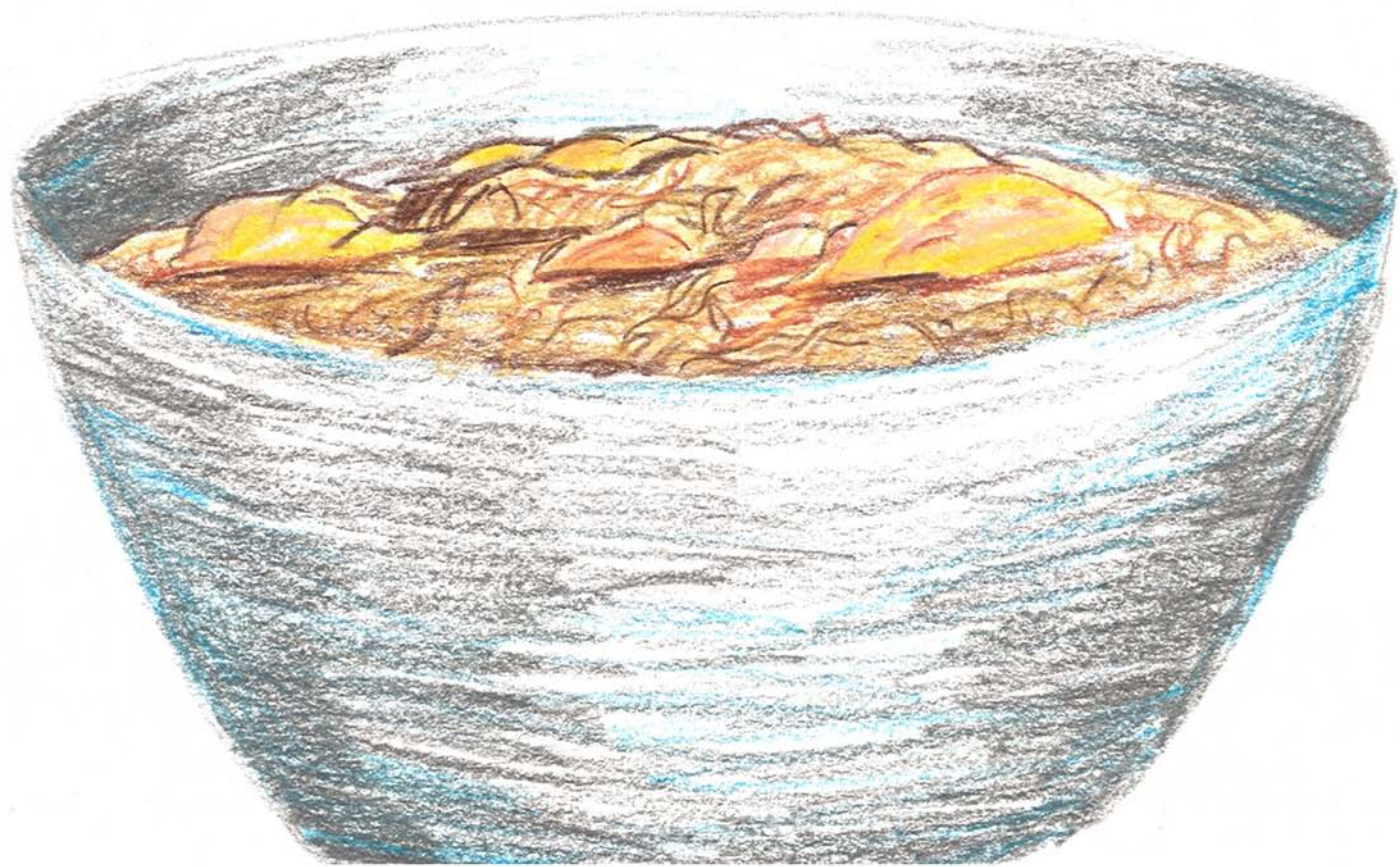


I dipped my spoon into the soup.
