The Division of Speech and Hearing Sciences in the School of Medicine at UNC - Chapel Hill is offering a specialized interdisciplinary Au.D. program focused on the preparation of pediatric audiologists to serve infants, toddlers, and school-age children with hearing loss. Financial support is provided by a training grant funded by the U.S. Department of Education.

We are interested in attracting students with a strong interest in pediatrics; however, the Au.D. program at UNC provides a full range of opportunities to acquire clinical experiences with patients of all ages. Graduates qualify for state licensure as well as ASHA and ABA certification. Racial/ethnic minorities, males, and people with hearing loss are currently under-represented in the audiology profession and are strongly encouraged to apply.
