| <p>Each LEA/Charter with a migrant count receives an allotment based on a needs based formula. The calculated funding rate is determined by dividing the total funds available by the weighted migratory head count. This amount is adjusted to a minimum equal to 1/2 the average teacher salary (\$47.70 per count, minimum \$23,915).</p> <p>\$100,000 is allotted to LEAs based on a percent to total of the LEAs' total dollars per average daily membership (state, federal and local) based on the most recent data available. This formula will be reversed in that the LEA with the lowest total dollars per ADM will receive the largest allotment.</p> | |
