### **1<sup>st</sup> Month Adjustments**

#### **Allotment Policy Manual**

*“If the higher of the first or second month average daily membership in a local school administrative unit is at least two percent (2%) or 100 students lower than the anticipated average daily membership used for the allotments for the unit, the State Board of Education shall reduce allotments for the unit. The reduced allotment shall be based on the higher of the first or second month average daily membership plus one-half of the number of students overestimated in the anticipated average daily membership.”*

The allotment adjustments required by this section will be made in the next allotment revision after **all** of the second month data has been received from the LEAs.
