He had always been interested in computers and technology, so after hearing about options available through the [North Carolina Virtual Public School](#) (NCVPS) overseen by the NC Department of Public Instruction (NCDPI), he decided to give online learning a try.

He started by enrolling in Spanish I and Algebra I courses. With guidance and support from his NCVPS teachers, Alex navigated lessons, submitted assignments and excelled in the online learning environment. Today, as a public high school senior in Charlotte, Alex is still taking courses through NCVPS and loving it.


