

# High School Assessments

8 <sup>th</sup> Grade Math Option	Local Assessment Option
Students may not be required to take both Math I EOC and Grade 8 Math EOG if a higher math assessment is available for these students in high school.	If the State approves, districts may use a nationally-recognized high school assessment in lieu of the state high school assessment



Would the nationally-recognized assessment serve as the higher math for high school, thus eliminating double testing in grade 8?
